Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. STANDARDIZED LABELS FOR RECYCLING 7 RECEPTACLES. 8

- (a) Purpose.—The purpose is utilize and implement guidelines for the national standardized labeling system for all recycling and composting receptacles; a design and format methodology which is consistent throughout the United States to assist members of the public to recycle and compost properly, wherever they might be. Material recovery facilities, recycling processing centers, and composting facilities will use the nationally standardized format and methodology to communicate the recyclables or compost materials accepted in their facilities. The recycling and compost haulers or municipality haulers that pick up recyclables and compost, will distribute the proper standardized labels to their customers or residents to display on all receptacles, all residential carts, and all dumpsters.
 - (b) Definitions.—In this section:
 - (1) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency.
 - (2) PUBLIC SPACE.—The term "public space" means a business, an airport, a school, a stadium, a government office, a park, and any other public space, as determined by the Administrator.
 - (3) RECYCLING OR COMPOST RECEPTACLE.—The term "recycling or compost receptacle" means a recycling or compost bin, cart, or dumpster.
 - (4) RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING OR COMPOST PROGRAM.—The term "residential recycling or compost program" means a recycling program that services single family dwellings, multifamily dwellings or facilities, or both.
 - (5) LABELS—The term "labels" means a medium such as a printed sticker, signage, banner, or an electronic medium to communicate the list of recyclables or compost materials accepted and the rules for sorting to members of the public, using the standardized methodology and design.
- (c) Guidelines.—The Administrator shall publish the guidelines for the national standardized labeling system for a material recovery facility and compost facility to use to develop the labels that-
 - (1) use the national standardized methodology of colors, images, format, and terminology;
 - (2) shall be placed on recycling and compost receptacles in the service territory of the material recovery facility in accordance with paragraphs (1)(D) and (2) of subsection (e); and

1	(3) communicate to users of those recycling and compost receptacles—
2	(A) the specific recyclables and compost materials that the material recovery facility or compost facility accepts; and
4 5	(B) the specific rules of sorting for that material recovery facility or compost facility.
6	(d) Development of the Standardized Labels.—
7 8 9 10 11	(1) IN GENERAL.—Each material recovery facility and compost facility in the United States shall, in accordance with the guidelines published under subsection (c), use the national standardized labeling guidelines to develop the labels for use on recycling or compost receptacles in the territory area of the material recovery facility to communicate to users of those recycling and compost receptacles—
12 13	(A) the specific recyclables that the material recovery facility accepts or compost items that compost processing center accepts; and
14 15	(B) the specific rules of sorting for that material recovery facility or compost facility.
16 17	(2) SIMPLE AND DETAILED VERSIONS.—In developing standardized labels under paragraph (1), a material recovery facility and compost facility shall develop—
18 19 20	(A) a simple version of the label for use on recycling or compost receptacles used in public spaces, which shall list the basic recyclables or compost materials that the material recovery facility or compost facility accepts; and
21 22 23 24 25	(B) a detailed version of the standardized label for use on recycling receptacles used as part of a residential recycling program or of a compost label for use on a compost receptacle, taking into consideration the complexity of the packaging and products or accepted compostable materials disposed of by single family dwellings and multifamily dwellings and facilities.
26	(e) Distribution of the Standardized Labels.—
27	(1) SIMPLE VERSION.—
28 29 30 31 32 33	(A) IN GENERAL.—A recycling hauler that delivers materials to a material recovery facility or compost hauler that delivers materials to a compost facility, shall distribute the simple version of the label developed by that material recovery facility or compost facility under subsection (d)(2)(A) to each customer of the recycling or compost hauler that owns or operates a public space in the service territory of the material recovery facility or compost facility.
34 35 36	(B) QUANTITY.—The quantity of labels distributed to an owner or operator of a public space under subparagraph (A) shall be reasonably sufficient to ensure that a label may be placed on each recycling receptacle in that public space.
37 38 39 40	(C) ADDITIONAL LABELS.—If the quantity of labels distributed under subparagraph (B) is insufficient, a recycling or compost hauler described in subparagraph (A) shall make available to owners and operators described in that subparagraph additional standardized labels to purchase or download.
